Family Eligibility

Families must demonstrate their need for affordable housing

- Must have children under age18 living at home
- Must be a permanent resident or Canadian citizen
- Must have lived in their current community for at least one year
- Must not have previously owned a home











- No lost work time. You will be paid for the days you work up to 5 days (Excluding travel and R&R)
- Habitat will pay ½ of your required donation (average donation is \$700)
- You must pay for airfare and R&R (the donation and airfare are tax deductible)





Fund for Humanity



Habitat homes are paid for by donations and volunteer labour, mortgage payments made by partner families are then used to build more homes.
