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Methodology

- Survey questions were administered through the *TrendWatch Alberta Omnibus Survey* between January 17 and 24, 2023.
- *TrendWatch Alberta* is a monthly omnibus survey of 900 Albertans, ages 18 and over. The margin of error for a probability sample of 900 people is plus or minus 3.3 percentage points, 19 times out of 20 (i.e., at a 95% confidence interval).

Survey Design

- Survey respondents were initially contacted at random by live telephone interviewers and given the option of:
 - answering the survey over telephone at that time,
 - answering over the telephone at a more convenient time, or
 - receiving the link and answering the survey on-line.
- The initial sample list contained approximately 50 percent landlines and 50 percent cellphones.
- Interviewers made up to five attempts to reach each phone number in the sample before classifying it as unreachable.

Interviews

- All surveys were conducted by qualified interviewers working out of Trend Research's centralized CATI facility in Edmonton. Field supervisors were always present to ensure accurate interviewing and recording of responses.
- The interviewing staff at Trend receives extensive training on the proper administration of interviews and are closely monitored by supervisors. A minimum of 10 percent of each interviewer's work was unobtrusively monitored for quality control in accordance with the standards set out by the Canadian Research Insights Council (CRIC).

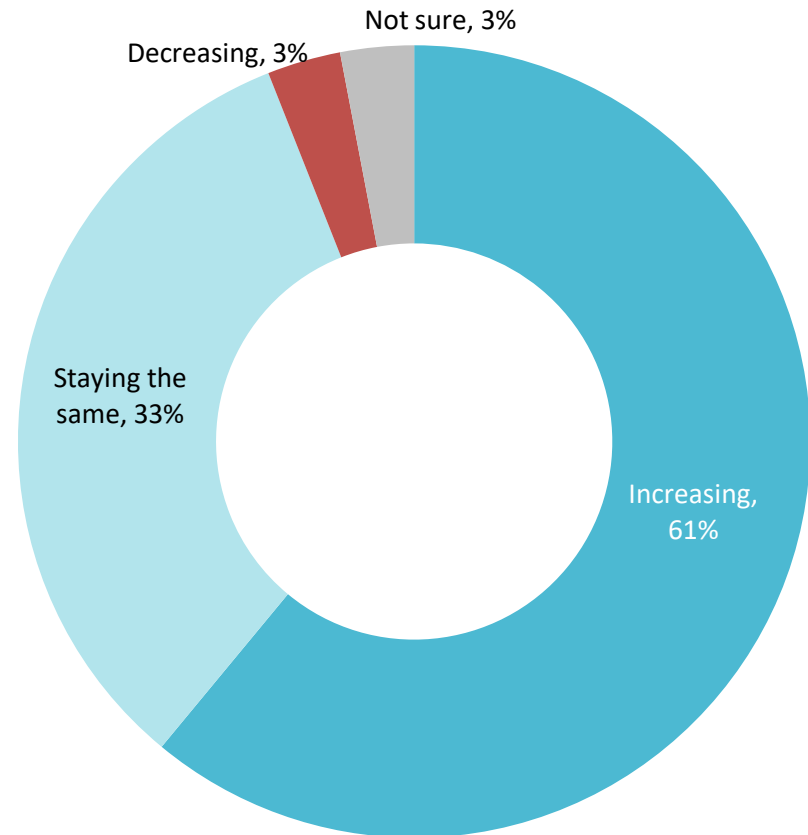
Survey Findings

Perceived Level of Crime

Six in ten Albertans (61%) believe crime is increasing in the part of Alberta where they live.

Women are particularly likely to believe crime is increasing where they live (67% versus 55% of men).

Concern about crime is consistent across all other subgroups, including age, income and education.

Causes of Crime

When asked, on an open-ended basis, what they believe are the major causes of crime in the part of Alberta where they live, the most common answers given are the economy and unemployment (38%), and drug and alcohol abuse (37%). Albertans also frequently mention homelessness and poverty (26%).

Those who are particularly likely to mention the economy and unemployment as a major cause of crime include:

- Those age 25 to 44 (47%), and
- Unemployed (45%) and full-time workers (43%).

Those most likely to mention drug and alcohol abuse include:

- Those living outside Calgary and Edmonton (44%).

Those most likely to mention homelessness and poverty include:

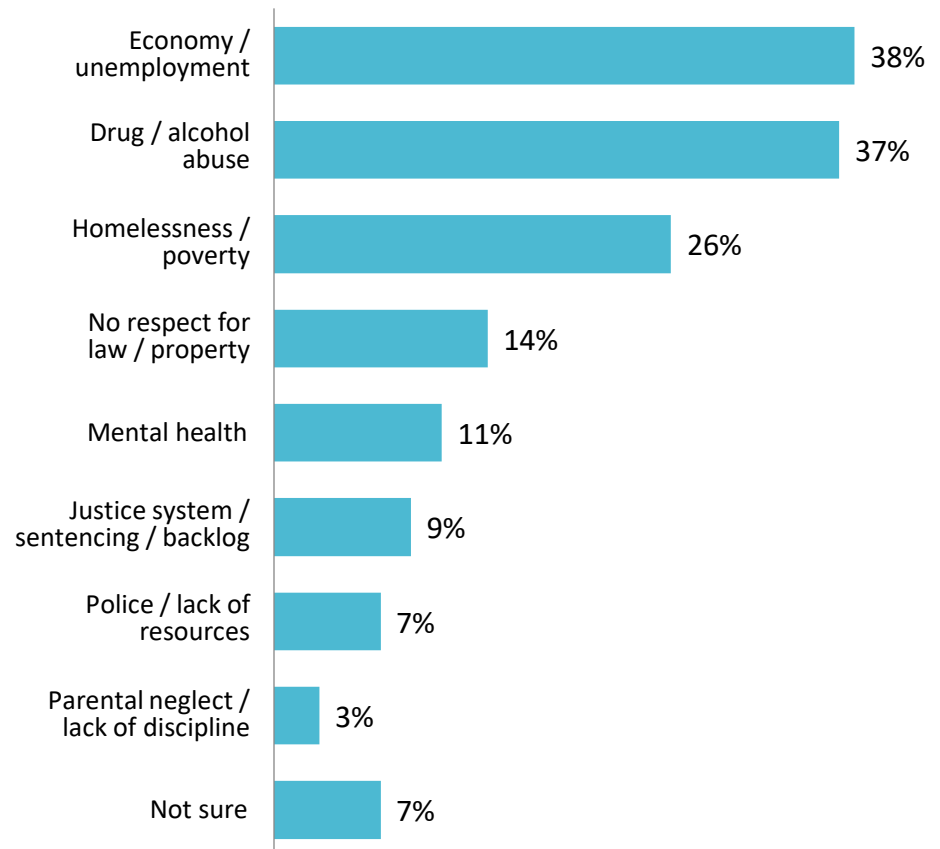
- Those with a post-graduate education (37%),
- Those age 18 to 24 (34%), and
- Those living in Edmonton (31%).

Those most likely to mention mental health include:

- Those living in Edmonton (20%),
- Those with a post-graduate education (16%), and
- Those age 25 to 44 (15%).

Those most likely to mention the justice system include:

- Those with a high school education or less (15%), and
- Those living outside Calgary and Edmonton (14%).

Impact on Reducing Crime

When presented with four ways to address crime and asked to rate the potential impact of each on a ten-point scale, Albertans give a high rating of 7.2 out of 10.0 to two of these options: making improvements to social services for marginalized and disadvantaged individuals, and improving the justice system to ensure adequate sentences.

Albertans also give a relatively high average rating of 6.4 to increasing funding for police services.

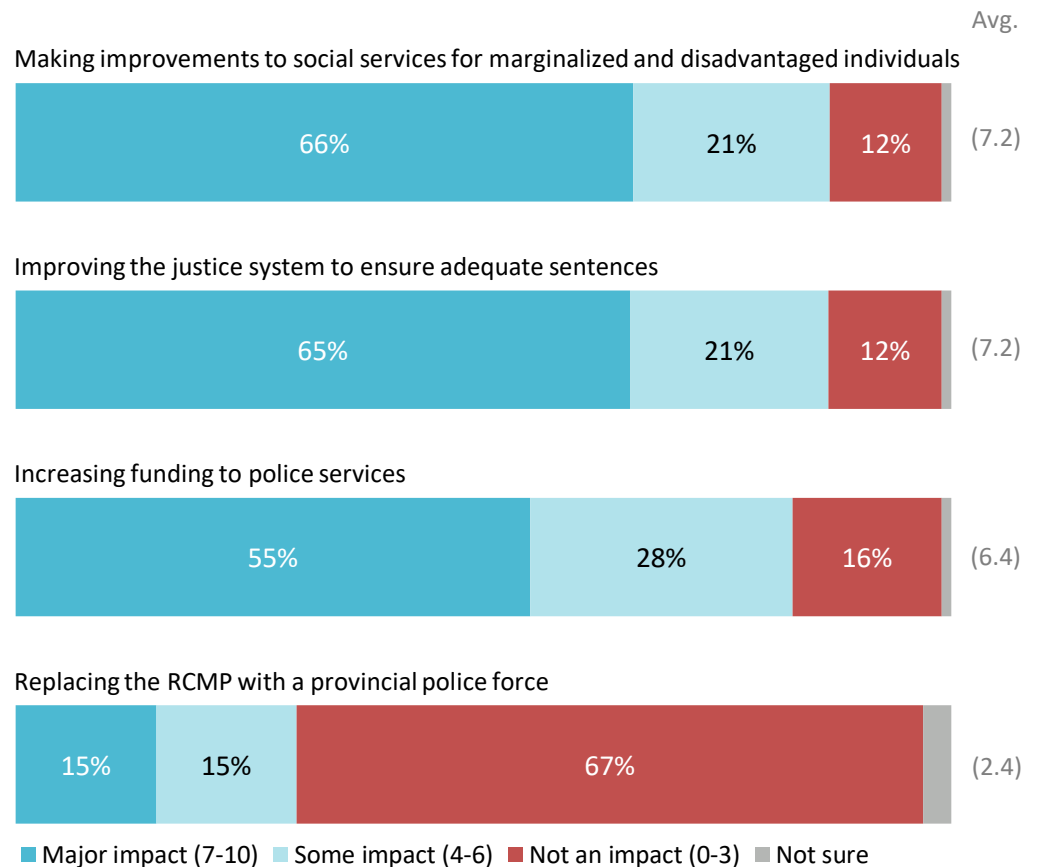
Alberta give a low average rating of 2.4 to the idea of replacing the RCMP with a provincial police force.

Those most likely to give a high rating of seven to ten to making improvements to social services include: those with a university education (76%), those age 25 to 44 (75%), those living in Edmonton (71%), and women (71%).

Those most likely to give a high rating to improving the justice system include: those living outside Calgary and Edmonton (74%), and those with a high school education or less (74%).

Those most likely to give a high rating to increasing funding to police services include: those age 65 and over (61%), and women (59%).

The proportion of Albertans giving a high rating to replacing the RCMP with a provincial police force is low across all subgroups, including those living outside Calgary and Edmonton (18%).

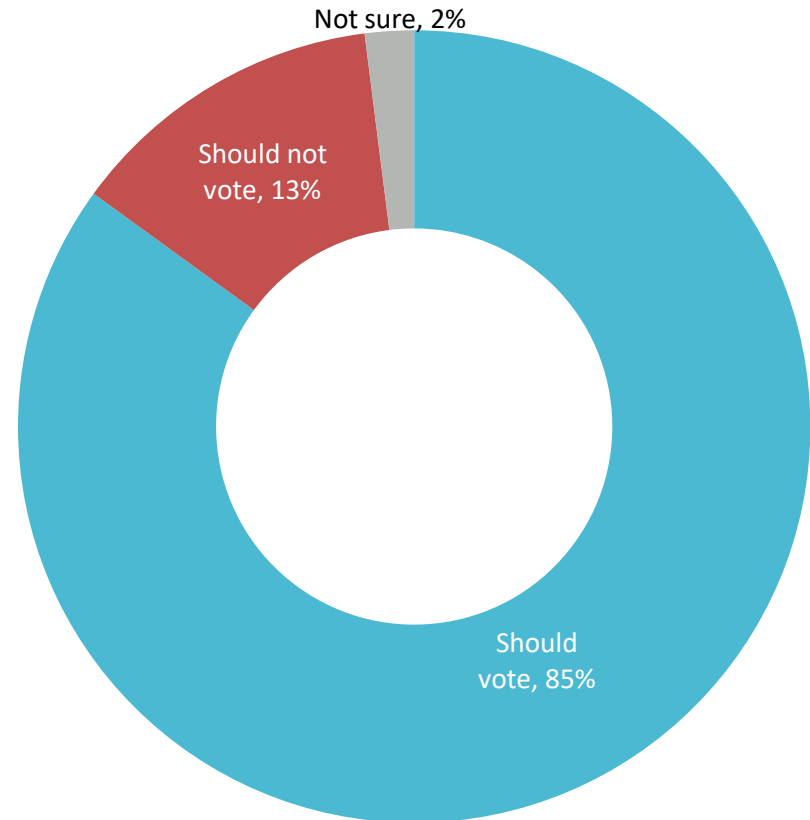

Referendum on Provincial Police Force

There is a strong consensus among Albertans (85%) that, if the Alberta Government were to move forward with a plan to create a provincial police force, this idea should be put to a vote, through a referendum. Only 13 per cent say it should not be put to a vote, and two per cent are unsure.

Agreement that this idea should be put to a vote is high among all subgroups examined, including those living outside Calgary and Edmonton (86%).
