Welcoming & Inclusive Communities Action Partnership (WICAP)



In 2016, Alberta Municipalities expanded our efforts to support our members' capacity to create Welcoming and Inclusive Communities with the help of grant funding received from Alberta's Ministry of Labour and Immigration.

That funding came to an end this past spring, so we wanted to take the opportunity to share about what we accomplished over that six-year period. WICAP was intended to build the capacity of Alberta's municipal governments to implement policies and practices that create communities that are more welcoming and inclusive. The underlying objective was to advance change at the community level so that newcomers and other diverse populations can lead lives free of racism, discrimination, and social exclusion. Here are some highlights.





Delivered 17 grants valued at over \$360,000

The Community Readiness for Newcomer Integration project funded seven municipalities to audit their community's ability to successfully welcome and support the integration of newcomers.

Meanwhile, eight municipalities accessed our Measuring Municipal Inclusion Grant where they evaluated their inclusiveness using our Measuring Inclusion Tool and then took steps to make improvements.



Future Direction

1. Welcoming and Integration of Newcomers

Alberta Municipalities is recommending that the Government of Alberta invest in WIC to support community leaders with additional education, training, and guidance to effectively welcome and support the integration of newcomers.

2. Dollar Matching Grants to Advance Municipal **Inclusion Initiatives**

To encourage further advancements in municipal leadership of EDI, Alberta Municipalities is recommending that the Government of Alberta offer dollar matching grants for municipal governments to invest in targeted inclusion initiatives.

3. Continued Funding for Alberta Municipalities to Develop WIC Tools and Education

Alberta Municipalities' survey of municipal representatives produced a broad list of requests for how WIC can offer additional support to create inclusive communities.



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
